



OS map, 1956-1972































Existing tree survey diagram

The site and its history Brent Cross (Northern Line)






Diagram to show constraints

Entrances are located away from the main central space




Green space lacks definition and hierarchy

All routes into the Estate are cul-de-sacs







Diagram to show opportunities

- Clear route connecting public footpaths and amenity
- ---- Public footpaths connecting to wider area
- Open space in front of towers provides an opportunity for a public square
- Opportunity to make a coherent street frontage

- New green spaces and play areas associated with specific buildings provide a sense of ownership

- Open views across allotments






Diagram to show retained and proposed buildings
